
An Educational, Interactive, Amazing Experience for K-6 Students Write On!


About the Author:

Workshop Menu:

Mix 'N Match to meet your organization's needs.

Writer's Workshop (K-2) (3-6) Large or Small Groups Students identify and apply the six traits of writing to Ethan Eats Hot Lunch and then participate in the writing process by Using the "how to get started" process with their own story idea. We will focus on character development, showing vs. telling, and descriptive word choice.

Revision & Editing Workshop (K-2) (3-6) Large or Small Groups

Students practice using revision strategies and the six traits of writing after being introduced to how the writing process was used to create *Ethan Eats Hot Lunch*. Once their draft is complete, we will apply the editing process in order to work toward a final draft.

Specific Grade Level Workshop (3-6)

This workshop addresses The Six Traits of writing—ideas, organization, voice, word choice, sentence fluency, conventions. Throughout the workshop, I use *Ethan Eats Hot Lunch* to model how the writing process works and how it can be applied to student writing, revising, and editing. I also conference with students one—on—one and in small groups giving feedback on their work. (One hour per class suggested).
